Another way to keep your bike out of harm's way is to use secure parking like the new Fietsenpakhuis bicycle warehouse in Zaandam by Dutch firm Nunc Architects. This free parking solution for 700 bicycles uses all locally sourced materials. Solar panels provide electricity for the bike repair, rental shop, public toilets and lockers, while the glass façade keeps the stored bicycles on display, inviting cyclists in.
